This half term I will

- Understand how to be safe around bonfires and fireworks:
- Understand what I need to do if I see a fire that is not safe.
- Be able to name a variety of different colours.
- Notice similarities and differences of between different celebrations.
- Understand that Christmas is a Christian holiday.
- Learn lots of Christmas songs and perform some of these during our Foundation Stage Nativity.
- Roast marshmallows around the campfire.
- Go on autumn walks and notice signs of autumn.
- Take part in lots of fine motor activities to strengthen my hand muscles.
- Learn about road safety when going on a walk to the post box to post our letters to Santa.
- Understand the concept of light and dark when learning about different celebrations.
- Learn about different colours and shapes.

You can support your child at home by

- Encouraging your child to talk in full sentences rather than using gestures and pointing.
- Looking for signs of autumn. We will be sending home a treasure bag for your child to collect autumnal treasures in.
- Talking about road safety when going on walks.
- Going on a shape hunt around your house and take time to count different quantities,
- making sure they are using shape and number names accurately.
- Talking to your child about what you celebrate as a family.
- Encouraging your child to dress themselves independently, including putting on their own socks, shoes and coat.
- Playing turn taking games including pairs and dominos.
- Reading lots of different books and talking about what you have read.
