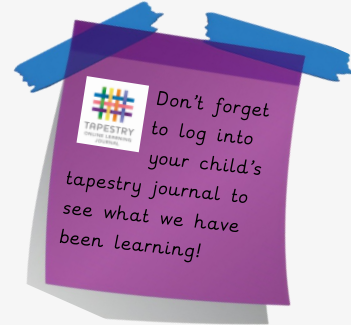

Welcome back for another half term. We have some fun and busy weeks ahead. We are going to begin our term by celebrating Pancake Day. We will be going on a local walk to Asda to buy the ingredients and working together to follow a recipe to make them.

Following this we are going to have a cold country focus. We will look at a globe and notice where different countries are around the world. We will then compare animals that live in cold places to animals that live in hot places like Kenya.

We will also be having a visit from Teach- Rex to immerse ourselves into our learning all about knights, castles and dragons. This is going to be a surprise for the children so try to keep a secret for now!



This half term I will

- Make pancakes to celebrate pancake day.
- Go on a walk to Asda to buy ingredients to make pancakes.
- Continue to develop my subitising skills.
- Take part in easter themed activities and listen to stories around Easter.
- Continue to learn to write the first initial or more letters of my name.
- Learn that in the past, knights wore metal armour to protect themselves when fighting.
- Understand that dragon are mythical creatures that breath fire.
- Be able to name features of a castle.
- Be able to compare the similarities and differences between a castle in the past and where I live now. For example: Toilets used to be benches with holes in where as now we have flushable toilets.
- Celebrate the Hindu festival, Holi.
- Make chocolate buns for Easter.

You can support your child at home by

- Going on walks together and noticing signs of spring.
- Continuing to read lots of stories together, talking about the author, characters and title.
- Talking about what they used to enjoy doing in the past or about different experiences they have had in the past.
- Encouraging your child to use a knife and fork to cut their food.
- Using the language full, half full and empty when making a drink or having a bath.
- Encouraging your child to speak in full sentences.
- Allowing your child to carry out small tasks to encourage independence.
- Encouraging your child to put on their own coat and zip up it up.
- Enjoying spending time together and having fun.
- Supporting your child to form the letters in their name correctly.
